Nathan A. Chowilawu-Eshe (pronounced chow-ee-la-woo, ah-shay) announces a charity version of his soon-to-be released book, titled My Love. My Love features love proverbs, love psalms & love poems, on loving a woman, being a man, and seeking God. The charity version of My Love is distinguished by the picture of a strong man bowing down before God, and will only be available through the author's website, NathanEshe.com. A portion of the proceeds will be shared with non-profit organizations that:

- Help women and children who are escaping a violent environment.
- Help women and children who are currently homeless.
- Help men become better men and fathers.

Eshe, a supporter of Sacramento women's organizations Women's Empowerment and D.O.V.E.S. Ministries, has always been an ally in the many struggles that women face today. "The women and children God gives us are our church and we should protect, provide and love them," says Eshe. "I hope this gesture helps women and children find some peace and comfort after being in such tough situations."

Also a supporter of the Sacramento-based father's group The Daddy's Here Program, Eshe hopes the success of My Love will help local men become better men and better fathers. "One of the most difficult challenges we have as men is finding our way to manhood and fatherhood when we haven't had a good example of that journey or path. I hope the support and success of My Love will lead to support and success for fathers in need."

Eshe's memoir, Hearing Voices, released in 2004, details his first person experiences being loved and sheltered by the women who raised him. It also details his own experiences being homeless, finding his way as a man, and using the example of the women in his life for parenting. "I know what it is to experience great love and shelter, and I know what it is to be homeless and fearful about parenting," says Eshe. "I just want to share some of the success my book has with women and men who need help or inspiration."

Nathan Eshe recently changed his name from Nathan A. Lewis, Sr. for spiritual reasons. The official release of My Love and the companion audio CD, U R My Healing, are scheduled for August 8, 2008.
